# Weekly Words from The Rock

## Baptism

On this, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, I want to look at the question, "Why do Catholics baptize infants?"

"Infant baptism has remained an area of concern for some non-Catholics and Catholics alike. Some say, "Shouldn't we wait for a child to grow up and then make his/her own decision to be baptized and become a Christian?" Along those same lines, we could ask such questions as, "Shouldn't we wait for a child to grow up before we teach him/her a certain language? After all, he or she might not like English."

Children obviously do not choose things such as who their parents are going to be, what country they are going to live in, where they are going to school, what they are going to eat in order to grow up healthy and strong. Parents make these decisions with the child's best interest in mind. They want what is best for their children and what will be of the most value for them as they mature and grow into adolescence and eventually adulthood. In a similar manner, bringing a child into God's family and raising him or her in the ways of the faith of Jesus Christ is simply a good thing to do. Just as a mother would not withhold milk from her baby, so too we should not withhold the grace of God from a child either. As Jesus himself said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them; for to such belongs the kingdom of God" (Matthew 19:14)."

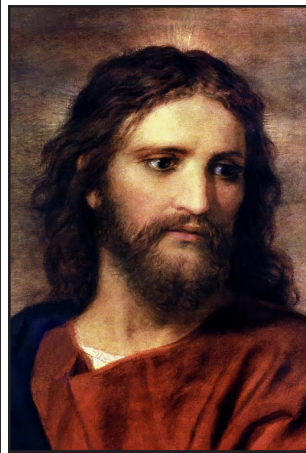

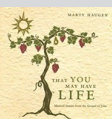
We have officially worked our way through the Christmas Liturgical Season. Today, let us celebrate the Baptism of the Lord! Typically, this day is celebrated the first Sunday after Epiphany. Once again, because Epiphany fell on its “correct” day, this makes the Baptism of the Lord the latest date it possibly can be – January 13<sup>th</sup>. This will not happen again until 2030, and has not happened since 2013.

Did you know that the Baptism of the Lord used to be celebrated with Epiphany? It was not its own celebration until 1955, when Pope Pius XII installed it as such. During his tenure, Saint Pope John Paul II instituted the custom of baptizing babies in the Sistine Chapel on this Feast Day. Due to the way our minds try to make sense of things, I know I personally have a hard time jumping from the arrival of the Three Kings to thirty years later when Jesus is baptized by John in the Jordan River. What happened over those thirty years? What was Jesus’ childhood like? We get a few glimpses, (where his family moved to and from, his time at the Temple, etc.) but not much. As Father Schuster mentioned in an earlier homily last year, we can presume that Jesus’ earthly father, Joseph, passed away at some stage. He would have also been schooled (in some way) in the Jewish belief system.

Really, though, we have few accounts of the time between his birth and his adult baptism, which is likely the reason why we mark the end of the Christmas season with it. We cannot help but wonder, though, what the child Jesus may really have been like!

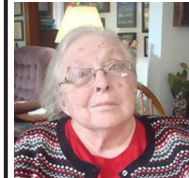
